Attention Northeast Georgia Scouts and Scouters

The BSA 100th Anniversary National Hall of Leadership provides a one-time opportunity for you to honor and recognize a Scouting leader who positively impacted your life, or the lives of others. To be nominated, a person must be a living Scout or Scouting volunteer who may or may not be officially registered with the BSA. They must have served as an active Scout or Scouting volunteer for at least one year. A nominee may be young or old — there is no age limit — and you can submit as many nominations as you'd like between now and February 8, 2010.

Inductees selected from your nominees will be given national recognition commemorating their leadership and dedication to living out Scouting virtues through service to others. One inductee will be selected from each local BSA council in the country along with one from the national office. Inductees will be announced at the BSA National Annual Meeting in Dallas, Texas in May 2010.

On-line nomination through the BSA National website takes only a few minutes. To complete the process a nominator will be asked to provide basic information about their nominee, themselves and a brief (maximum 450 word) story of how the nominee demonstrated extraordinary leadership and Scouting virtues in ways that made a meaningful difference in the lives of others.
