Course Dates & Locations:

First Training Session will be held on Saturday, October 26, 2019 and will begin promptly at 10:00 AM at the Big House at Scoutland on Lake Lanier in Gainesville, GA. The First Training Session is mandatory for all participants.

Each participant should bring the following: pocket knife, whetstone, camp saw (bow saw), hand axe, 8 -10 inch mill bastard file, leather gloves, knuckle guard, file handle, safety eyewear, and sturdy boots (see Boy Scout handbook).

Course Weekend will be held November 8-10, 2019, at Scoutland on Lake Lanier in Gainesville (see www.nega-bsa.org or NEGA Service Center for map & directions). This will begin Friday, November 8th promptly at 3:00 PM, participants must arrive and set up prior to this time, and will conclude Sunday, November 10th shortly past sundown. Please do not commit to the training if you will be unable to meet the time commitments. Participants will be outdoors the entire weekend and sleeping in tents. (No, really)

Registration fee is \$85.00.

Last day to register will be Saturday, October 26th.

Participation is limited to 32 participants due to the hands on nature of the course.

The registration fee includes a course hat, some meals and all program materials for the course.
