Class Descriptions

CS - Scoutbook Training for Cub Scout leaders	Learn to navigate the intricacies of Scoutbook and apply that knowledge in your Pack. Practical presentation, examples of site applications and Q & A. Training will include Scoutbook Plus.
CS- Teaching Knife Safety to your Cub Scouts	Teaching Knife Safety to your Cub Scouts Learn basic knife safety and how to teach your Cubs the requirements they need for their adventures. Learn techniques for yourself and ways to make learning knife skills fun.
CS- Webelos to Scouts BSA Crossover for Leaders & Parents	Learn how to prepare your Scouts & their families for Scouts BSA. Learn from the troop perspective, what to do, what to ask, and what to look for. This course is a must for Cubmasters, Committee members and Webelos Den leaders.

All participants completing this class will be qualified to be the Rangemaster for Cub Scout activities at Camp Rainey Mountain, Scoutland, and Cub Scout Day Camp.

CS- Putting the 'Outing' in Scouting- Outdoor Meetings, Hikes & More	We'll tell you how to plan and conduct fun outdoor meetings and weekly activities with special attention to the Cub Scout Outdoor Activity award, World Conservation, and Leave No Trace.
CS- Running a Pack on a Budget	Yes, you can run a Pack on a budget! Get practical solutions to help your Pack provide a quality program that your Cubs will enjoy while you work on growing the Pack bank account.
CS- Facilitating Cub Scout Bicycling Adventures Electives	Are you interested in your Den or Pack fulfilling the activities necessary to complete the cycling adventures electives? If so, come to this class taught by Cate Kreider, Safety Educations Programs' Specialist for Go Georgia, a statewide bicycle and pedestrian safety non-profit. We will review the skills checks necessary for each age level, discuss strategies to teach the knowledge requirements and outline simple exercises that can demonstrate on-bike mastery. We will also share information to engage with parents about bicycling safety.
CS- Cubs to Arrow of Light Leader Transition	This class is intended to help Cub Scout Leaders transition to Arrow of Light leaders and learn how to navigate the program. Den Leaders will learn about the new program changes, the purpose and methods of the Arrow of Light Scout program, the Patrol Method and receive tips on how to make their Patrol a success. Recommended for Webelos (4th grade) den leaders.

**GEN - Backcountry
Hygiene**

If you are going to Philmont, or any backpacking trip more than a few days, or would like more information about keeping your Scouts clean(er) on the trail, then this is the class for you. Nothing can ruin a trek faster than a personal issue that sidelines a hike, and embarrasses a Scout. We will discuss the importance of and techniques for staying clean, caring for your feet, laundry, and (of course,) some female “need to knows” as well. Although this is a serious class, bring your sense of humor, and don’t be squeamish. We will talk openly about some real life issues in order to insure everyone is well prepared and has a great time.

**GEN - Outdoor
Ethics-Incorporating
Leave No Trace**

This workshop briefly outlines the history of low impact outdoor skills taught by the BSA and relevance to the Seven Principles of Leave No Trace. Emphasis will be placed on the front country, where most of BSA’s outdoor program takes place. Learn more about Leave No Trace as it has been incorporated into rank advancement and awards, including the Scouting, BSA leadership role of Outdoor Ethics Guide. This course may be taken by itself or in combination with the Skills and Activities Session.

**GEN- First
Aid/CPR/AED Training**

The Scout Oath instills in youth that, “On my honor I will do my best ... to help other people at all times.” Emergency care is no exception. Learn to properly administer CPR and how to properly use an AED to help save a life. Two year certification through the American Heart Association.

**GEN - Dutch Oven
Cooking**

Learn how to prepare great meals in the outdoors that will delight any palate. Dutch Oven cooking is a unique and fun way to prepare delicious meals and desserts that are sure to amaze those on your campout. In addition to the Dutch Oven fundamentals, you will learn a variety of techniques that will allow you to prepare simple to elaborate recipes. This is an interactive course so not only do you get to prepare the meals from start to finish, but you also get to eat the results as well. How exciting is that!!

GEN - Essentials in Serving Scouts with Disabilities	Essentials in Serving Scouts with Disabilities This course is designed to increase awareness and help leaders and instructors create a positive program for all scouts, including scouts with special needs. Specific emphasis on scouts with Anxiety, Depression, Disruptive Mood Dysregulation Disorder, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Autism, and Specific Learning Disabilities.
GEN - Fishing - Basics for Leaders	An intro to fishing skills, tools and techniques for hook and worm fishing to prepare leaders to teach Cubs and Scouts basic fishing skills to help them be more successful at catching fish.
GEN - Basic Knot Tying- Knots Required for Advancement	Basic Knot Tying- Knots Required for Advancement The basic knots all Scouts should know have to be taught by someone! Come and learn these scout required knots so that you can pass on that knowledge to your Scouts!
GEN - Paracord Projects for everyone	We will use paracord to help bring knot tying and paracord projects to your troop from a woggle, zipper pulls, stopper knots, parabuddies and to wrapping a handle. Participants bring: Pocket knife (under 2" length); Lighter; 50ft of paracord (available at hardware stores).
GEN - NEGA Campmaster Training- Join the corps or just find out more about us!	Who are Campmasters? Campmasters are the liaisons between campers and the Camp Ranger. Why do we need them? Campmasters help the ranger do his job and fill in so he doesn't work seven days a week. Come learn how you can become a Campmaster, spend a couple spare weekends each year at camp, enjoy the outdoors and serve our youth.
GEN - All About Philmont Scout Ranch	This essential, hands-on course prepares Advisors and Scouts for a successful Philmont high-adventure trek. We cover critical wilderness skills specific to the New Mexico mountains, including map and compass navigation, rigorous Leave No Trace practices, efficient pack fitting and gear management, backcountry cooking, and high-altitude first aid. Participants will gain the confidence and practical knowledge needed to manage trail logistics, stay safe, and thrive as a cohesive crew.
GEN - Recognizing the Risks - QPR (Question,	QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer) training teaches people how to recognize signs of suicidal behavior, talk to someone at risk, and guide them to get help.

Persuade, and Refer) Training for All	It's about empowering individuals to intervene effectively and potentially save lives.
GEN - Teaching & Enabling Youth to be an Upstander	Preparing Scouts & their Leaders for Outdoor Adventure Programs. This class is based on the premise that scouts and adults should stand up and speak up if they see something they think is wrong or if they see that a fellow scout is struggling.
GEN - Fundamentals Part 1: Science of Training (formerly Fundamentals of Training)	This course is designed to help Scouts and Scouters, regardless of their training experience, identify effective training methods for a variety of purposes. It will help freshen up the skills of current Scouting America trainers, as well. The skills and strategies presented here have been shown to improve teaching and learning—and will be of value to you, not only in your role in Scouting, but also in the ways that you communicate with others.
GEN - Fundamentals Part 2: Craft of Training (formerly Trainers EDGE) (ALL DAY)	This course is the second part of the train-the-trainer continuum. As trainers develop their training skills, this course provides an opportunity for trainers to practice and refine their abilities through experiential learning, paired with feedback from faculty members and peers. This course also supplements the training development sessions offered during faculty development for advanced leadership training courses.
GEN - What is Venturing?	The Crew organize their own activities, which are centered on four core areas: Adventure, Leadership, Service, and Personal Growth. Typical activities include backpacking trips, white-water rafting, community service projects, and business start-up challenges. The program's aim is to foster leadership, ethics, and a sense of adventure as participants explore potential careers, develop independence, and become responsible citizens.
GEN - Project Management	Project Management: Introduction to basic principles on Project Management, tools and techniques, and how to adapt them to Scouting.
GEN - What is a Unit Commissioner?	What Unit Commissioners do and what is the importance of unit engagement?

GEN - Primitive Fire Craft	Learn the methods and concepts behind making primitive fire building skills, including bow drill friction fire, traditional flint and steel, making char material and "bird's nests," and how to blow an ember into flame. You will walk away from this hands on course knowing how to make fire utilizing these methods, as well as find and utilize different natural fire materials.
GEN - International Scouting	Scouting isn't just an American adventure — it's a worldwide movement connecting over 50 million Scouts across more than 170 countries! In this class, we'll journey beyond our borders to discover the rich traditions, symbols, and stories that unite Scouts around the globe. Learn about the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), World Scout Jamborees, international awards, and opportunities for Scouts and leaders to connect through global events and exchanges. Whether you're preparing your Scouts for international travel, looking to introduce global Scouting themes into your unit, or simply curious about how Baden-Powell's vision grew into a worldwide family, this session will expand your understanding.
GEN - Eagle Coach/ Navigating the Eagle Project Process	Helping scouts achieve Eagle Scout rank is something that all scouters strive for. However, it goes beyond just getting the project done. Eagle Coach is not just a person who approves scouts' work. Scouts often struggle navigating the process. A coach should be someone who guides the scout through that process: from project selection, project planning and execution and final writeup. In this class you will learn how to help scouts avoid pitfalls, what are the most common issues, and what are available resources to be an effective coach.
GEN - Roundtable: What is the purpose and how can it be better?	A general overview of what Roundtable is all about and how it applies to every scouter.

This hands-on session will walk you through the features, reports, and best practices of Commissioner Tools within my.Scouting. Learn how to log contacts, track unit health, identify trends, and use the data to better support the Packs, Troops, and Crews you serve. Whether you're a new commissioner learning the basics or an experienced one looking to get more from the system, this class will help you confidently use Commissioner Tools to make your service more effective and efficient.
GEN - How a Commissioner Can Help Your Unit	Do you know what a Commissioner actually does — and how they can help your unit succeed? In this session, we'll uncover the many ways Commissioners support Packs, Troops, and Crews. From guiding recharter to strengthening program quality and leader engagement, Commissioners are your partners in ensuring every Scout has a great experience. You'll learn how to connect with your District Commissioner team, what resources are available to your unit, and how this vital role works behind the scenes to make Scouting stronger.
GEN - Scouting Heritage	Discover the story of Scouting — where it began, how it's grown, and why it continues to inspire millions of young people around the world. This class explores the traditions, values, and moments that have shaped Scouting into the movement we know today. Participants will gain a deeper appreciation for Scouting's roots and how its history still influences today's programs and leaders.
GEN- Introduction to Project Leadership	A brief introduction to the intersection of project management and leadership skills to help accomplish many goals. We will explore the lens of a service project and your role as an adult leader.
GEN - Northeast Georgia Council Properties	What our properties are, what they have to offer, and what you can do to help them.

GEN- Roundtable is for Everyone	A general overview of what Roundtable is all about and how it applies to every scouter.
GEN - Interfaith Services and Principles	How to conduct them and why they matter: Come learn how Interfaith Services can change the face of your unit. We will discover the why, and learn the how of incorporating interfaith services and elements into your program.
GEN - ILSC (Venturing)	The Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews Course (ILSC) has been created to help Venturers learn and practice the attitudes and skills that good leaders demonstrate. The course is a series of lessons divided into three modules: Leading Self, Leading Others, and Leading Crews. If you are 14 years old and up to 20 years old and are in or are joining a Crew before the Course, you are welcome to register and learn about what it means to be part of a Crew! The Course is a full day of instruction, but may vary depending on the games selected and discussions. Completion of ILSC is a prerequisite for Venturers to participate in the more advanced leadership courses, such as, National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT), and National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE).
GEN - Lodge Leadership Development	Order of the Arrow
GEN - Youth Leadership Councils	Youth leadership is at the heart of Scouting. This class explores how to form, guide, and sustain effective Youth Leadership Councils — Learn how to give Scouts a voice in planning activities, shaping their program, and building real leadership skills through hands-on decision-making. Participants will discover strategies for mentoring youth leaders while allowing them to take ownership of their Scouting experience.
GEN - Scoutmaster Conference	The Scoutmaster Conference is more than a requirement — it's a powerful moment of mentorship. In this class, we'll explore the purpose, process, and best practices for conducting meaningful Scoutmaster Conferences that encourage personal growth, reflection, and goal setting. Learn how to create a supportive

GEN - Board of Review	A Board of Review is more than a step toward advancement — it's an opportunity to celebrate progress, encourage growth, and strengthen a Scout's confidence. This class will explore the purpose, structure, and best practices for conducting effective Boards of Review at all ranks. Learn how to create a welcoming environment, ask meaningful questions, and ensure the process reflects the spirit of Scouting rather than a test of knowledge.
GEN - Venturing Goal Setting and Time Management	Finding a successful time management strategy depends on each individual's personality, ability to self-motivate, and level of self-discipline. This course introduces established methods for improving a Venturer's ability to effectively manage a daily timeline in his or her life.
GEN - Venturing Project Management	This training will prepare Venturers to identify, plan, and execute projects in an efficient manner, while encouraging personal growth and development.
GEN - Leadership Training for Youth	The <i>Leadership Training for Youth</i> program helps Explorers, Venturers and Scouts BSA build confidence, teamwork, and communication skills while learning what it means to be a great leader. Through fun activities, group challenges, and real-life examples, participants will discover how to set goals, solve problems, and make a positive impact in their unit and community. Youth will also learn how to lead with respect, kindness, and integrity — preparing them to take on leadership roles in their units.
GEN - Role of An Exploring Advisor	Learn the role of an Exploring Advisor.
GEN - Strengthening Ties With Your Church Charter Organization	In the NEGA Council, churches are the largest charter organization! This class will explore strategies to improve communication with your church, prevent (and resolve) conflict and recruit within the congregational community.

Typically, it is held after the Scout completes all requirements for a rank, but before the board of review. The Scoutmaster conference determines if the Scout is ready to go before the board. This class will help you evaluate your advancement program by asking the right questions and getting the right answers.
SBSA - Eagle Advisors/Coaches	This class is a guided discussion ideal for both new and experienced Life to Eagle coaches, Scoutmasters, Advancement coordinators and Eagle Board members, covering Eagle Scout advancement, and the Eagle Scout Service Project process from Life BOR to Eagle BOR. Learn from and discuss with each other what the process should be to keep BSA's Eagle standards high.
SBSA - Eagle Scout Service Project (ESSP) - a Guide to Successful Preparation	A complete tutorial on completing your Eagle Scout Service Project Workbook from the Proposal thru the final report.
SBSA - Teaching Totin' Chip to New Scouts	How to safely teach young scouts to use knives, saws, axes and hatchets: what tools to use when, which tools to buy for your unit and tips and tricks on safety and teaching smaller scouts.
SBSA - Backpacking and Wilderness Camping	Backpacking and wilderness camping is where the traditional scouting skills come together for an immersive outdoor experience. We'll look at options for the "Big Three" gear items, including How to ensure your backpack "fits." Are you ready for the Backcountry?
