



2026 SHOOTING SPORTS EVENT REGISTRATION

Cub Scout Rangemaster Class

March 21, 2026 (Spring Fling), TBD (Scout Show), or April 25, 2026 (Spring Family Camping)

9 am-4 pm

Cub Scouts require trained shooting sports instructors, too! Starting with the Lion rank, Cub Scouts can participate in archery or slingshot activities with an adult partner, and when they move up to Tigers, they can use BB rifles with an adult partner. Tiger, Wolf, Bear, Webelos, and Arrow of Light ranks can do archery, BB shooting, and slingshots at any District or Council event. At the Rangemaster training, you will learn about how to set up a safe Cub Scout shooting sports range for all these activities, the history of BB shooting and archery, parts of the BB rifle, slingshot, and bow and arrow, BSA processes, rules and regulations for shooting sports, including safety rules and shooting fundamentals, as well as learn how to help the Cub Scout shoot successfully.

This training class is offered at no charge every spring, usually at Spring Fling at Scoutland, Scout Show, and Spring Family Camping at Camp Rainey Mountain. Additional classes may be scheduled throughout the year.

Only council- or district-owned equipment may be used on Archery, BB gun, and Slingshot ranges. Personally owned equipment is expressly prohibited on a Cub Scout range. All BB Rifles, Archery, and Slingshot equipment are owned by the NEGA Council. No personally owned firearms are allowed on any Scouting range while Archery, BB gun, or Slingshot activities are in progress.

This is a full-day class, with only a brief break for lunch. Please come prepared!

Per BSA policies, completion of this course will provide the training necessary to lead Cub Scout archery or BB ranges at a district or council event **ONLY**- Cub Scout packs are prohibited from doing shooting as a unit or den activity.

There are no provisions for childcare at these courses. There may be a live range.

You must be present for the entire class to receive credit.

This certification is valid for two years, and then the class must be repeated.

Uniforms are not required.

As with all BSA activities, Youth Protection Training is required of all adult leaders in attendance.

A printed (or electronic) copy of the certificate is your ticket for entry.
